Human Being (HB):
 A human being is a flesh and blood homospic body.
 A human being can be created by two human beings through sexual reproduction.
 The point at which a human being comes into existence is debated.
 A human being is sometimes created by two human beings with the aid of one or more natural or artificial persons.
 A human being can be destroyed by another human being, natural person or artificial person.
 The point at which a human being passes from existence is debated.
 Human beings can only be in one place and only live for several decades.
 Human beings are concerned with survival and reproduction.
 Human beings can possess.

Natural Person (NP):
 A transferable bundle of rights and duties that can be attached to only one human being.
 A born human being can be in possession of one or more natural persons.
 A natural person can be created by one human being, or by two or more natural persons, or one or more artificial persons.
 A natural person is created when first recognised by other natural or artificial persons.
 Natural persons and human beings are commonly mistaken for each other.
 A natural person can be destroyed by a human being in possession of an artificial person.
 Natural persons can be in many places at once and can only live for several decades.
 Natural persons are concerned with property.
 Natural persons can outlive their human being possessors.
 Natural persons can own, use and control.

Artificial Person (AP):
 A transferable bundle of rights and duties that can be attached to one or more natural persons, or one or more artificial persons, or both, e.g. a corporation.
 A natural person can control one or more artificial persons.
 An artificial person can control one or more artificial persons.
 An artificial person can sometimes control solely of one natural person, e.g. a corporation sole.
 Natural persons and artificial persons are commonly mistaken for each other.
 Artificial persons can be destroyed by natural persons and artificial persons.
 Artificial persons can be in many places at once and can live forever.
 Artificial persons are concerned with power.
 Artificial persons can outlive their Natural Person owners - they have perpetual succession.
